

INTRODUCTION

The NSW Office of Sport is proposing a sustainable network of regional level sport and recreation facilities that meet the needs of stakeholders and communities. This includes regional sport hubs and/or regionally significant sport facilities.

The planning for sport hubs supports local Councils and the sport sector by aligning their objectives and priorities for a common purpose and vision. It also encourages stakeholders to identify priorities that focus on increasing participation, contribute to regional and economic growth, and deliver sustainable assets that are well used and designed as 'facilities for all'.

The Office of Sport envisages a Regional Sport Hub as one which meets the following broad criteria:

- A sport or recreation facility (either single purpose or community sporting hub) that meets the standards required to host major regional/state level competitions, events and/or training
- Provides a range of participation outcomes (community, competitions, events and talent development)
- Caters for a broad catchment across multiple local government boundaries, and
- Delivers flexibility of use, high quality amenity, management and service levels.

AUDIT PROCESS


Who will audit the facilities? Facilities audit to be primarily conducted by NNSWF in conjunction with Zones

How will the data be captured? Through a purposed built Sports Facility Auditor (SFA) Program. This is a mobile facility auditing, database and reporting program designed for football to better assess and understand levels of facility provision, condition, compliance and risk.

When can we audit our facilities? The audit will be rolled out from early 2018.



5 STEPS TO SUCCESS




GIS CONNECTIVITY

Map and layer facility data as required by:

- Venue hierarchy
- Pitch numbers
- Playing surface(s)
- Floodlighting levels
- Life-cycle / condition rating
- Clubrooms
- Change rooms (players and umpires)
- Spectator amenity

Facility attributes can be overlayed with population and participation data and with planning overlays including:

- Local Government areas
- Local Planning Scheme
- ABS statistical areas
- Postcodes
- Electoral boundaries
- Football regions
