- The Program aims to improve football facilities for a variety of benefits including increasing participation, improving safety and security, assisting in building stronger communities through football and improving the overall football experience for all stakeholders.

Important Information

- Only member Clubs or Zones can apply
- Minimum amount is \$20,000
- Maximum amount is \$100,000
- The Program may fund up to 50% of the net project cost. (ie: minimum project cost is \$40,000)
- Co-contribution of at least 50% (eg: club, sponsors, Local, State or Federal govt, voluntary labour, donated materials or equipment, other successful grants, etc)



Important Information

- Must submit application on time
- Must have land owners consent
- Address at least one (1) of the Program's Objectives
- Provide a letter of support from your Zone
- Provide a letter of support from local council (if council owned)
- Provide proof of co-contribution (eg: within letter from council, bank statement, letter from sponsor, successful grant letter, etc)
- If required, must have an approved DA

Projects Not Funded

What projects will not be funded:

- Purchase of land;
- Projects that are in the planning phase and require, but are yet to receive, development consent from Local Council or Government Agency;
- General maintenance or replacement through normal wear and tear
- Equipment (e.g. computers, office goods, footballs, clothing, uniforms and footwear);
- Rent or associated occupancy payments;
- Requests for feasibility, design or development stages of a project;
- Projects that are not primarily used for the club's football activities;
- Projects that will not be completed within a two-year timeframe, from agreement of funding to completion;
- Projects that have commenced or been completed;
- Wages for administrative and/or executive staff; and
- Administration costs.



Assessment & Criteria

- Applications will be assessed as eligible & complete
- Then assessed on merit & scored against the Program's criteria (refer guidelines)
- Projects must be completed within two years of the date of signing the Program's funding agreement.



How to Apply

There are five steps in the application process:

- 3. Read the Guidelines to familiarise yourself with the Program process and requirements.
- 4. Complete the online application.
- 5. Submit the application by 5 pm on the closing date.

Example Responses

Primary Objective 1: Provide more opportunities for more participants to play more football, more often;

- The lighting project will increase the number of hours training and games can be played on the current ground. Note: currently there are no available facilities to cater for this need proximal to......
- The project will achieve this Objective as it will provide lighting that is necessary to provide well-lit and safe playing and training fields for night-time use. This is crucial and will allow the Club to provide more opportunities for more participants to play more football more often. The existing lighting only allows for one of the Club's fields to be used at night time and that existing lighting is old and of poorer quality. The project will assist the Club's goal to work towards providing the best possible quality playing and training facilities and to make them accessible and usable for night-time use. The project will provide the Club with the ability to attract additional registered players to the game and reduce the percentage of players who might drop out of the game because of poor facilities and limitations on the ability to schedule night time fixtures and training sessions.



Example Responses

Primary Objective 3: Address issues which undermine the safety of participants;

- Failing floodlights will make training more difficult and potentially hazardous as players attempt to continue training as the natural light is fading.
- The project will meet this Objective and enable the Club to address current issues associated with existing inferior lighting conditions which undermine the safety of participants. Presently, only Field 1 has lighting and the standard of that lighting is inferior. When Field 1 is being used for matches at night, the lights do not provide a consistent level of illumination across the entire playing surface. The project will allow for the replacement of the inferior lighting which will provide consistent and higher levels of illumination over the entire playing surface and provide the safest possible lighting conditions for players, referees, coaches and volunteers. There are currently no lights on Field 2 at all and night time training sessions rely on the Field 1 lights and the glow, or half-light, from those lights for use of limited areas of Field 2 after dark. This creates a potentially dangerous situation where there might a number of teams training in poorly lit conditions in a confined area on field 2. The potential for injuries to be sustained under the current poorer lighting conditions is greater. The provision of the best possible quality lighting to both Fields 1 and 2 via the project will eliminate the current potential safety issues arising from the existing poor lighting and improve the safety of players, referees, coaches and volunteers



Grant Opportunities

The Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program

\$4 million over four years to assist sporting clubs across NSW in the purchase and maintenance of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

Grant Opportunities

Local Sport Grant Program

The \$4.6M Program aims to increase regular and on-going participation opportunities in sport and active recreation.

There are four project types within the Program:

- Sport Development \$2,000 max
- Community Sport Events \$5,000 max
- Sport Access \$5,000 max
- Facility Development \$15,000 max
- \$85,000 has been allocated to Zone 1 electorates regional drought affected areas
- \$35,000 has been allocated to Zone 2 electorates.
- Organisations must contribute to the project, the higher the contribution the more favourably it will be looked upon.
- Open now, closes Monday 5pm 25 November 2019.



Grant Opportunities

NSW Community Building Partnership program

- Primarily for infrastructure projects that deliver positive social, environmental and recreational outcomes, while promoting community participation, inclusion and cohesion.
- \$300,000 is allocated for successful projects within each NSW electorate.
- Min amount \$2,500 (average grant approx. \$20,000)
- No co-contribution required, although any amount is looked upon favourably.
